Step 1: Design and Planning

He needs to choose the size and look of the guitar. Then he plans his design on paper.



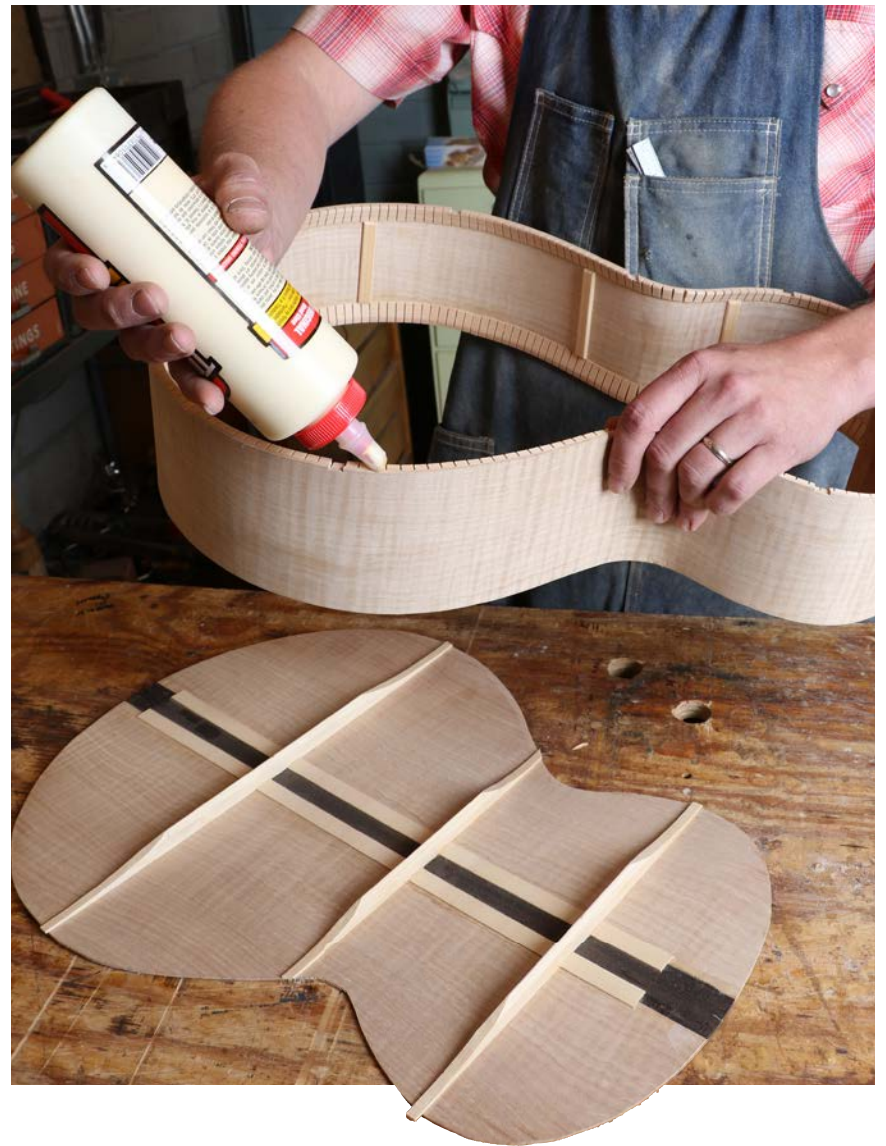
Step 2: Tracing and Cutting

Step 3: Bending

Stephen bends the wood for the body of the guitar. He uses steam to help bend the wood.



Step 4: Gluing

Next, he glues the body together.



Step 5: Preparing the Body

He sands the wood to make it smooth.



Step 6: Attaching the Neck

Next, he glues the neck to the body.

He uses clamps to hold the neck in place while the glue dries.



Step 7: Staining and Buffing

Then, Stephen stains the wood. Stain changes the color of the wood and makes it beautiful. When the wood is dry, he buffs it to a shine.
